When a patient or family member cannot be transported via a commercial airline, ground ambulance, nor train, air ambulance transport may be required. Patients may need an air ambulance transport for several reasons:

What is the JET I.C.U. Air Ambulance Transport Process?

The air ambulance process begins with a phone call or email received by our 24/7 communication and operations center. Our flight coordinators then guide you through the air transport process. This includes discussing the safest and most cost efficient options to suit the individual needs of the patient.

From that point forward, JET I.C.U. coordinates all details of the transport. This includes obtaining medical information from both the sending and receiving facilities, coordinating all air and ground transportation logistics, and establish communication between the patient, family member, physicians, and JET I.C.U. medical team.

The JET I.C.U. team will then meet the patient at the bedside and obtain any necessary updates from the sending facility. The patient and family member(s) are then escorted to the airport via ground ambulance. During the flight, our medical team carefully monitors and cares for the patient while our pilots safely navigate to the destination location. While the transport is taking place, our flight coordinators remain in contact with the flight team and medical team to maintain continuity of care. This is done by communicating and updating necessary contacts throughout the transport process. Our primary goal is to make the transport seamless for both the patient and family member(s).

Once the aircraft arrives safely at the destination airport, a ground ambulance will be standing by to transport the patient, JET I.C.U. medical team, and family members to the receiving facility. The medical team then ensures that the receiving facility has obtained a complete updated medical report on the patient's condition prior to final transfer of care.
